Voter Registration

To vote either in-person or absentee in an election, you must first be registered to vote. In the State of Wisconsin, you can register to vote on Election Day at your polling place. Here are some helpful resources to help you register to vote.

Eligible Voters

Are you Eligible to Vote?

- You are a citizen of the United States.
- Will be at least 18 years old on or before Election Day.
- Have resided at your address at least 28 consecutive days prior to the election and do not currently intend to move.
- Are not currently serving a sentence including incarceration, parole, probation or extended supervision for a felony conviction.

Am I Registered to Vote?

Before you start the registration process, check to make sure that you are not already registered to vote.

How to Register

- Register by mail. Voters may register by mail until 20 days before an election by completing
 the <u>Voter Registration Application</u> and mailing it with a copy of acceptable proof of resident to
 City Clerk, 201 S Main Street, PO Box D, Greenwood, WI 54437.
- Register Online with a current and valid Wisconsin Driver License at MyVote.WI.Gov Voters may register online until 20 days before an election. The online registration is checked against Wisconsin Department of Motor Vehicle (DMV) records, no additional proof is needed.
- Completing the <u>Voter Registration Application</u> in advance.
- **Register at the Polls on Election Day.** You must bring proof of residence and photo identification. Consider completing the Voter Registration Application in advance.

Proof of Residence

Proof of Residence is required to vote in Wisconsin. The proof of residence document must include your current name and current address. For example, proof of residence could be a current Wisconsin Driver License, utility bill, or residential lease. A more complete list may be found at: https://elections.wi.gov/Register
